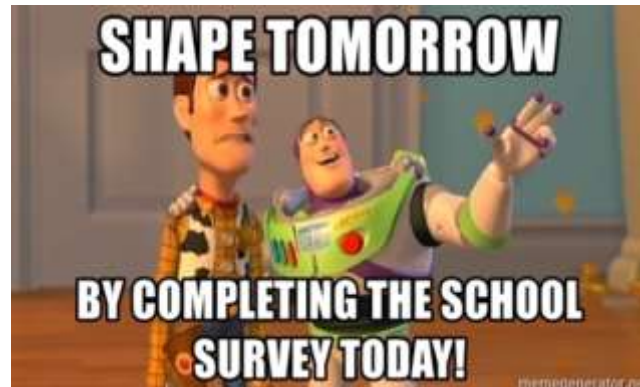

Last year, the Indigenous Literacy Foundation raised over \$190,000 from the Great Book Swap and this year their goal is to raise \$300,000 to gift 30,000 new books to remote communities who have few to none. After all, how can you learn to read without books? Help us help them by attending our great book swap and donating old books and making a gold coin donation to take a book home to enjoy with your family.

How does the Great Book Swap work?

1. Collect any books or good quality magazines you have at home that you would like to donate to the book swap. Bring them to the school so we can sort and display them for the Book Swap. (You can bring them on the day but earlier is great.)
2. Let all your friends and colleagues know the book swap is on so they can join in. Into Social Media? Share information about the Indigenous Literacy Foundation and the Great Book Swap.
3. Come along during the swap week with your coins to donate and select some books to take home. **Book Swap will operate before and after school every day during Book Week August 20 – 24.**



All money raised goes to The Indigenous Literacy Foundation to promote literacy in remote Indigenous communities. We can't donate books directly to the communities because the Foundation is seeking to source and publish culturally relevant books to the communities. Some of the books they have published are in local languages, contain traditional legends and stories or have indigenous author and illustrators.
